

EXAMPLES Chlorine Phosgene

CHOKING AGENTS

Attacks lung tissue when inhaled, leading to respiratory failure. Cause severe, often permanent, lung damage, or death.



EXAMPLES Sarin VX

NERVE AGENTS

Disrupts nerve cells from sending signals to organs and muscles, causing convulsions, paralysis, and respiratory failure. Highly lethal.



EXAMPLES Hydrogen Cyanide

BLOOD AGENTS

Some types cause red blood cells to burst, while others disrupt blood cells' ability to process oxygen. Often fatal.




EXAMPLES

BLISTER AGENTS

Cause burns or severe blisters on the skin, eyes, and lungs, as well as possible airway irritation. Not typically fatal, but neurological effects or a blocked airway can cause death.
