• In the NSG since 1997




- Latvia 1st Baltic country chairing the NSG

NSG complements legally-binding elements of the **global nuclear non-proliferation regime**:

- Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (entry into force 1970)
- Treaties on Nuclear-Weapon-Free Zones
- IAEA Safeguards Agreements
- UN Security Council Resolution 1540 (2004)



NSG complements other multilateral export control regimes:

- Zangger Committee (ZC) Nuclear
- Australia Group (AG) Chemical and Biological
- Missile Technology Control Regime (MTCR) Missiles
- Wassenaar Arrangement (WA) Conventional



Future of NSG in the nuclear world
