

Based on the international and commonly used European Union's Export Control List for Military and Dual-Use items.

Strategic Items



If a person is <u>informed by the</u> relevant authority;

OR

If a person knows/has reason to believe that the item will or may be used for a restricted activity





STRATEGIC TRADE ACT (STA) 2010



- focal point for STA 2010 custodian of Law
- responsible for overall strategic trade management
- maintains online system



- licensing, issues policy, guidelines, SOP, conducts outreach, ICP approval,
- Leads audit and interdiction teams

Categories of Online Permits



Multiple Permit*

MULTIPLE EXPORTS OR
TRANSHIPMENT of the items for
DIFFERENT COUNTRIES /
DESTINATIONS,
Valid for 2 years

Single permit

ONE-TIME EXPORT, TRANSHIPMENT
OR BRING IN TRANSIT PERMIT for a
SINGLE COUNTRY / DESTINATION,
Valid for 6 months

3

Bulk Permit*

MULTIPLE EXPORTS OR
TRANSHIPMENT of items for a
SINGLE COUNTRY / DESTINATION,
Valid for 2 years

*Requires Internal Compliance
Programme (ICP)

Special Permit

ONE-TIME EXPORT, TRANSHIPMENT OR BRING IN TRANSIT PERMIT for a SINGLE COUNTRY / DESTINATION which the end-user is a RESTRICTED END-USER,

Valid for 1 year



Compounding Penalty Regulations

Malaysia is at the stage of finalising the compounding penalty regulations.

The implementation is targeted to take into effect by end of this year.



Targeted Financial Sanctions (TFS) Relating to Proliferation

The UNSC has imposed certain measures relating to prevention, suppression and disruption of proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) and its finance. One of these measures is targeted financial sanctions related to proliferation.



Intangible Technology Transfer (ITT) Guideline

To ensure that control is exercised over ITT for dual-use and weapons technology as guidance. Currently, Malaysia aggressively conduct outreach to industry and engaging research institution.



Internal Compliance Programme (ICP) Enhancement

Malaysia is planning to enhance the elements and criteria under the current ICP procedure. This is to ensure company complies with the Strategic Trade Act 2010 and associated Regulations.











Challenges





Multiple agencies coordination - Different segments: policy, licensing, enforcement, technical and other domestic laws



Identification of strategic items



Lack of awareness of Strategic Trade Act 2010

- Educating/ outreach to new companies, freight forwarders and shippers
- Post Declaration is not accepted under STA 2010



Lack of expertise and experience, especially in areas such as intangible technology transfer (ITT) and proliferation financing



Commitment from Malaysian companies - need a change in mindset: MNCs and SMEs-different approach required
